Easter

National Tests

National tests will be taking place from May 7th-14th for all pupils in Year 2 to Year 6.

There are two numeracy tests, one procedural and one reasoning and a reading test.

There is nothing that parents can do to prepare your children for the tests, apart from give reassurance. All we can ask is that the children try their very best, as we know how hard they all work throughout the year.

Pupils in KS2 have recently taken part in tennis and swimming and I would like to congratulate them all on how well they represented the school. It is always pleasing to hear good reports from staff and often from others about how well-mannered and well behaved our children are.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast club will continue as normal this term.

After School

Year 5 and 6 will be taught by Mr. Jarman, who we have welcomed to the school as our new Deputy Headteacher this term. This will provide important continuity for the pupils in Year 4 and 5 who have faced disruption due to staff changes this year.
